From Monsignor Ron ...

Our faith is based on the belief that God became man. We believe that one of the reasons why he became man was to show us how to love God and love our neighbour. The reason for this is that our relationship with our God is what gives meaning and purpose to our lives and our relationship with our neighbour is what enables us to grow as loving people. In our lives, we are called to think and to act like Jesus and to strive to have his attitudes and values. This will not happen automatically, but it will begin to happen when we finally accept in our hearts that our happiness and meaning in life lie in our identification with Jesus.

How often do we use the approach of Samuel? Here I am Lord I come to do your will! How often do we try to find out what God wants of us today, in this situation and at this moment? How often do we pray about the ordinary things we do to make sure not only that we do the right thing but that we do the best thing always?

If we are going to do this, we need to discover what Jesus would think of our actions and also discover how he would behave in our situation. We need to be committed to discovering God's will for us at this moment.

Each one of us needs to have a really good relationship with God. This means more than just knowing about him; it means knowing him personally. This is an important lesson in the gospel passage: the disciples spent time with Jesus. Yet, how much time do we really spend in prayer? How often do we talk to God during the day? How often do we receive the sacrament of Reconciliation? How often do we try to grow in our understanding of the faith? These are the ways we attune ourselves to

God's will. However, if we are not prepared to take these steps, we are making hard work, if not impossible work, of being Christians. Our aim must be to make God central to our lives. Today we are presented with some means of doing this; we need to accept that is time-consuming and demands a constant commitment to be a Christian.

In the final analysis, it is up to each one of us. Our God wants to do so much for us, but first, we must allow him to enter into our lives.

Beatitudes for Still-Seeking People

Blessed are those who ask difficult questions: they are honouring their God-given brains.

Blessed are those who don't have glib answers: they offer a refreshing change.

Blessed are those who are not afraid to say, "I do not know for sure" or "I could be wrong:" their integrity will be rewarded.

Blessed are those who respect different ways of praising God: gifts will be given to them.

Blessed are those who is coming to faith was gentle and unspectacular: they are good people to be with.

Blessed are those who listen quietly to others hurts: they will be known as sensitive friends.

Blessed are you when you are awed by the Mystery of God, can find few words to describe your highest experiences, and so love your neighbour that you can be supportive of others they take different paths from yours. Some may tell you that you are not a proper Christian, but she will be on the way to wholeness as a human being.
