From Monsígnor Ron ...

We know that Jesus established the Church. We also know that he guaranteed that the Holy Spirit would guide this Church throughout the ages. At the same time this Church is made up of human beings. What we see in our reading from the Acts of the Apostles this weekend is one of the first disagreements amongst the members of the Church. There is nothing wrong with such disagreements so long as all parties are seeking the truth and in the case of the Church trying to discern the Will of God by seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit. What we can always be confident about is that despite the foibles of the human beings that make up the Church, the Holy Spirit is always there as the one true guide.

In the case mentioned today, we saw the introduction of married Deacons. This arose out of a need that existed and flowed from disagreements on how that need should be met. But what we see as an end result is a gift from God of the Married Diaconate.

This is particularly relevant in our day and age where there has been the reinstitution of the Married Diaconate who are ordained to the sacrament of Holy Orders and exercise vital ministries in the Church. We have a number of these men in our diocese and there are a number still in training. They celebrate Baptism; they officiate at Marriages; they preach at Mass and on other occasions. Their call is a special ministry, to be of service of the church and the people of the church.

I would like to briefly touch on our gospel reading this weekend in which we have the disciples feeling distressed and sad because Jesus is leading them. The answer of Jesus is important to them and to us. Basically, he says to them that in spite of what happens they are to keep on trusting in God and in him. Jesus also tells them that he is preparing a place for them for eternity which is a point we all need to keep in mind as we live through our daily lives, the point that this is not the end of our existence or the totality of our existence but simply a stepping stone to our lives with God forever.

Finally, I would like to suggest that during this week we reflect on this gospel reading particularly the following sentences:

"Do not let your hearts be troubled."

"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life."

"You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me."

"Whoever believes in me...will perform even greater works, because I am going to the Father."

Lessons from the

BLESSED VIRGIN MARY I believe the best teaching Mary has given to us was when she met the Archangel Gabriel. This is a lesson we need to take away with us today. Mary responded, "You see before you the Lord's servant, let it happen to me as you have said." (Luke 1:38) Mary did not have to do anything, just let God do the action. It is the same for us. All that is necessary for us is to allow God dwell in us. Every time we say to God, "You see before you the Lord's servant", God comes down from heaven again, there is another Christmas and the place where we are is another Bethlehem. Let us pray now for a moment, telling God that we are his servants, asking God to let it happen to us as he has said....
