Feast of St Andrew the Apostle

St Andrew is the patron saint of our parish community and we should celebrate his feast day. There will be celebration of Mass at 9:15am on Wednesday, November 30 and at 7:00pm on Wednesday evening.

St. Andrew, the Apostle Andrew heard about Jesus Christ, and then followed after Him. You, too, have heard of Christ; but are you following Him? Furthermore, Andrew not only followed Christ, but found his brother and brought him to Jesus. Are you willing to be like St Andrew – willing to find and bring others to Christ? Are you willing to be like St. Peter – willing to be found and brought to Christ?

Like any of the Apostles, Andrew does not have any outstanding qualification that makes him in any way eligible to be an apostle. Yet the Lord called him into his close circle of friends and entrusted him with the noble task of proclaiming the Good News of Salvation. This is the mystery of the Apostolic calling: out of God's graciousness and kindness he called individuals not because they are the best and most worthy but rather the Lord filled them with his love and blessings. And this is open for all who are ready and willing to entrust themselves to the Lord. The only thing needed is our full cooperation say yes to the Lord and God will do the rest.

Being an apostle of the Lord does not mean doing complicated things like going to some faraway place and meeting different kind of people. The Apostle Andrew has shown us that it is simply bringing someone to Jesus.

Whatever we do in life and wherever we are if we live out our faith and we are faithful to Christ we can be an Apostle like Andrew. Let us then be an Apostle who brings our brothers and sisters, friends and family to Christ. Let our witnessing and faithfulness to Christ also lead others to Christ. As one saying goes, "Christ lives in you, his mission continuous through you."

From Monsignor Ron ...

We begin the season of Advent by hearing God's word challenge us to wake up, to stand ready and to prepare. The whole season of Advent is a time for looking at the big picture, not just to prepare to celebrate the birth of the Saviour, but to see how ready we are to welcome him at his Second Coming, on that day when each of us will meet him face-to-face.

It is very easy for us to be caught up by the many things which claim our attention each day such as our jobs, our problems, our health, our families, our relationships, our plans and so on. One of the dangers of doing this is that we do not consider sufficiently the purpose of our life. We live as though we are going to live for ever in this world. We forget about the purpose and the meaning of life. This time of Advent is a time for slowing down and making time to reflect on these important questions.

As St Paul tells us this weekend, this is the time to put on our Lord Jesus Christ, to become the people we were intended to be in God's mind and to continue the journey that began at our Baptism. It is time to turn away from all the things that create barriers between us and our God, a time to turn back and walk as children of the light.

Most of all, we need to live in a state of expectation. We need to live as if we expect Jesus to return at any moment. By this I don't mean that we cringe in fear or ignore our daily duties and responsibilities. What is important is that we see our lives in their proper context and allow our faith to affect our daily living. It is about reminding ourselves of why we are here in this world and what our lives are for.

One of the things that we can do is to become more aware of the way that our God is present to us each day. Staying awake is a good way to describe the attitudes necessary to do this for to stay awake is to be alert. We need to be aware of what is going on and to be on the lookout for the presence of our God amongst us. By staying awake, we heighten our ability to seek the presence of the Lord in our daily lives, in the Eucharist, in his Word, and in each other.

The Season of Advent

There is a twofold aspect to Advent: it is a time of preparation for Christmas in which the first coming of Jesus Christ is recalled. As well, it directs our thoughts to the second coming of Christ.

Each Sunday of Advent has a distinctive theme. The first Sunday focuses on the Lord's coming at the end of time. The second and third Sundays focus on John the Baptist. The fourth Sunday focuses on the events that prepared for and immediately preceded the birth of the Lord. I believe that advent helps us to appreciate God's faithful love for his people and the great blessings he has bestowed upon us in Jesus Christ. Advent is not a time for penance or sadness but rather is a time of joyful expectation. But it is also a time where we renew ourselves and prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus Christ once more liturgically into our lives.

INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR THE ELIMINATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN:

The United Nations (UN) International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women on 25 November, raises public awareness of violence against women in all countries around the world and at all levels of society. The costs and consequence of violence against women last for generations. We can help through prayer and increasing public awareness.

Globally 35% of women and girls experience some form of physical and or sexual violence in their lifetime, with up to 7 in 10 women facing this abuse in some countries. An estimated 133 million girls and women have experienced some form of female genital mutilation. Worldwide, more than 700 million women alive today were married as children, 250 million of whom were married before the age of 15. Girls who marry before the age of 18 are less likely to complete their education and more likely to experience domestic violence and complications in childbirth.

The Australian domestic and family violence statistics are alarming:

- 1 in 5 Australian women have experienced sexual violence;
- 1 in 4 Australian women have experienced physical or sexual violence by an intimate partner; and
- 1 in 3 Australian women have experienced physical violence.
