From Monsígnor Ron ...

We might be tempted to think that St Paul was being somewhat unreal when he tells us to dismiss all types of anxieties from our minds. It is important to reflect about what he is saying. For one thing, he is certainly not suggesting that we ignore the difficulties that come our way in daily living. Nor is he suggesting that we stop becoming involved in life. What he is saying is that we need to accept the reality that difficulties will always be present, but, at the same time, we need to remember that God is always with us and he is always committed to supporting us in the best possible way he can.

On our part, we need to learn to spend quality time in the presence of the Lord and accepting that this will provide us with the balance and perspective needed to face whatever life tosses at us. It is important to accept that God is on our side and that it is in our relationship with God alone that we will find inner peace.

However, for this to happen, we need to take what is happening in our lives to our prayer time to talk over these things with our loving God. I do not believe we can stress the importance of this sufficiently. Prayer time is not just about saying prayers. It is about talking over what is important in our lives with our God. In doing this, it is essential that we do not do all the talking but allow plenty of quiet time. We have every reason to trust that God will support us, that he will give us encouragement, aid, and his strength in the best possible way. What is important in this statement is that God will help us in the best possible way. To use a rather simplistic example, if we pray to win the lottery to help us in our financial problems, it is unlikely that it will happen. However, we may gain insights and direction from our prayer time that will lead us down a better path.

When we pray, we are acknowledging that we are in the presence of God. Since we can pray anywhere and at any time, we know that God is with us in every moment. Consequently, when we come to pray we are reminding ourselves that we have the greatest power on earth available to help us to work through whatever is happening in our lives and to discover something positive. While we may not discover solutions to our problems, we can still be at peace because we come to know more clearly our dependency upon our God and more importantly his love for us. We also discover the reality of our importance to him and his desire to walk with us through all the circumstances of life.

Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, September 26, 2017: The attendance at this meeting was extremely poor and this was disappointing as we hoped to plan for the remainder of the year, and to commence looking at what we as a parish community could reasonably hope to achieve in 2018. Unfortunately, with the poor attendance this was not possible.

Certainly, we have confirmed some activities for the month of October. There are the special Marion celebrations on October 7 and October 13. The legionary will once again take responsibility for leading the Rosary before each of our weekend celebrations of Mass.

As well, we will be having our annual Bereavement Mass on Friday, November 3 at 7.00pm. This is a special occasion for those who have lost a loved one but also a wonderful opportunity for all of us to remember the extended family belong to as members of God's family. In doing this, we pray throughout the month of November for the Souls in Purgatory that they may quickly enter into the fullness of eternal life. One of the other matters raised was the necessity of having a 'working bee' in the Fr. Byrne Centre. This will be coordinated by the three main groups currently using the Centre. These are the Legion of Mary, HJM, and Couples for Christ. As well, all those who use this Centre are asked to ensure that everything is tidy when they finish, rubbish is taken to the bins, lights turned out, windows closed and doors locked.

All parishioners and groups in the parish are reminded that the Parish Pastoral Council is the forum where events are booked and organised in the light of the parish. More material will follow next week.
