
Liturgy Conference presented by Office for Worship

From Monsignor Ron ...

St Paul presents three thoughts we need to incorporate into our lives if we are going to live successful lives in the eyes of God.

Firstly: I am ready always for anything life brings, for there is nothing I cannot overcome since I have God's help always to strengthen me. Do we really believe that God is actively and personally involved in the lives of each one of us?

Secondly: If we share the hardship of others and help them, God will fulfil our needs lavishly. We are most receptive to God in our lives when we reach out to others, and this is especially true when we reach out to people in need.

Thirdly: The most important things in life are accepting God as God and always wanting what he wants. The place we give to God in our lives is important for balance, perspective and purpose. As well, seeking to act always as God would expect us to act is the key to success.

St Paul really lived out this philosophy of life. As a result, he was able to face difficulties and trials with the same confidence as he faced good times. This was so because he was convinced that God was with him, loving and supporting him all the time. Difficulties were not made easier, but Paul knew he was never alone and that God was present, loving and helping him.

To attain this approach to life is very important, and our parable today offers some very practical and positive suggestions. Jesus is saying that while God Our Father has opened wide the doors of heaven and invited everybody into his kingdom, entrance is by no means automatic and should not be taken for granted. We have to work and be spiritually

prepared. We need to attempt to prove ourselves worthy of the invitation. The point that Jesus is making is that there is no room for complacency because membership of the Church does not guarantee salvation.

We are invited every day to follow Jesus more closely. The question we need to ask ourselves is how are we living our Christian life?

This is an important lesson from today's parable. Saying 'yes' to God is the start of a way of living that affects our whole approach to life and to every aspect of life. It should affect every day, in fact every minute of our lives.

NOVEMBER MASSES FOR THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

November is a special time to pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a church on November 2 and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and Prayer for the Pope's intentions.

During the month of November Masses are prayed for the faithful departed. The names of these people for whom Masses are requested are placed on the wall of the Church. November Mass Offering Envelopes are available at the doors of the Church. The usual offering is \$20. You are requested to print the name of the deceased so that it can be easily read.

THE MINISTRY OF BEING A CATECHIST:

The reality is each and every one of us is called to witness to and proclaim and be an apostle of the Good News proclaimed by Jesus Christ. This is part of the privilege of belonging to the family of God.

MESSAGE OF POPE FRANCIS FOR WORLD MISSION DAY 2017 Mission at the heart of the Christian faith

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Once again this year, World Mission Day gathers us around the person of Jesus, "the very first and greatest evangelizer" (Paul VI, *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, 7), who continually sends us forth to proclaim the Gospel of the love of God the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit. This Day invites us to reflect anew on the *mission at the heart of the Christian faith*. The Church is missionary by nature; otherwise, she would no longer be the Church of Christ, but one group among many others that soon end up serving their purpose and passing away. So it is important to ask ourselves certain questions about our Christian identity and our responsibility as believers in a world marked by confusion, disappointment and frustration, and torn by numerous fratricidal wars that unjustly target the innocent. What is the *basis* of our mission? What is the *heart* of our mission? What are the *essential approaches* we need to take in carrying out our mission?

Mission and the transformative power of the Gospel of Christ, the Way, the Truth and the Life

The Church's mission, directed to all men and women of good will, is based on the transformative power of the Gospel. The Gospel is Good News filled with contagious joy, for it contains and offers new life: the life of the Risen Christ who, by bestowing his life-giving Spirit, becomes for us the Way, the Truth and the Life (cf. *Jn* 14:6). He is the *Way* who invites us to follow him with confidence and courage. In following Jesus as our *Way*, we experience *Truth* and receive his *Life*, which is fullness of communion with God the Father in the power of the Holy Spirit. That life sets us free from every kind of selfishness, and is a source of creativity in love.

God the Father desires this existential transformation of his sons and daughters, a transformation that finds expression in worship in spirit and truth (cf. *Jn* 4:23-24), through a life guided by the Holy Spirit in imitation of Jesus the Son to the glory of God the Father. "The glory of God is the living man" (Irenaeus, *Adversus Haereses* IV, 20, 7). The preaching of the Gospel thus becomes a vital and effective word that accomplishes what it proclaims (cf. *Is* 55:10-11): Jesus Christ, who constantly takes flesh in every human situation (cf. *Jn* 1:14).

The service of the Pontifical Mission Societies

9. The Pontifical Mission Societies are a precious means of awakening in every Christian community a desire to reach beyond its own confines and security in order to proclaim the Gospel to all. In them, thanks to a profound missionary spirituality, nurtured daily, and a constant commitment to raising missionary awareness and enthusiasm, young people, adults, families, priests, bishops and men and women religious work to develop a missionary heart in everyone. World Mission Day, promoted by the Society of the Propagation of the Faith, is a good opportunity for enabling the missionary heart of Christian communities to join in prayer, testimony of life and communion of goods, in responding to the vast and pressing needs of evangelization.
