From Monsignor Ron ...

This weekend we are asked to reflect on our confidence and trust in our loving God and in his plans for us and for our world. This confidence and trust should lead us to respond by becoming more committed disciples of Jesus.

We began with a reading from Ezekiel this weekend. I find three important messages in this passage. The first is that God always takes the initiative in our world and in the spreading of his kingdom of love. The second is that, on our part, we need patience, faith, prayer, and especially the spiritual vision to discover the growth of the kingdom in our world, in our lives and in the events that occur around us. The third point is that we need a commitment to look for and carry out what he wants us to do in all the events of our daily lives throughout every day.

Then we moved on to St Paul writing to us as he wrote to the Corinthians. I think St Paul is telling us how to live our lives with faith now at this time. We are on a journey of faith and because we do believe, we know that our God is near to us in every moment. St Paul reminds us to live our lives realising that this is a time of preparation for eternal life. No matter what life tosses at us we are encouraged to live in such a way as to please our God in all things because we do believe that life has meaning and purpose and is meant to be lived with our loving God.

Our gospel reading this weekend presented us with two parables, the parable of the seed that grows and the parable of the mustard seed. In the first parable we see that the farmer does not know how the seed grows for it has a secret of life and of growth within itself. We are reminded that God alone has the secret of life. Then we have the

parable of the mustard seed and are told that its growth to its full potential is an image of the kingdom of God where there is a home for all who enter. There is continuous growth, but it is going to be slow growth. What we do believe is that it is always becoming what God intends it to be and that we are involved in helping this to come about.

There is a wonderful quote which has many variations. One of them is the following — You are writing a gospel, a chapter each day, by the deeds that you do and the words that you say. People read what you write, if it's false or it's true. What do you want the gospel according to you to be?

adopted sons and daughters, already born again to
eternal life in Baptism, that he will graciously pour out the
Holy Spirit upon them to confirm them with his abundant
gifts, and through his anointing conform them more fully
to Christ, the Son of God.

(All pray in silence for a short time.)

Celebrant: Almighty God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who brought these your servants to new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, freeing them from sin: send upon them, O Lord, the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete; give them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and fortitude, the spirit of knowledge and piety; fill them with the spirit of the fear of the Lord.

Today, then, let us learn what to do when we are in need of real change. And who among us does not need a change? Particularly when we are downcast, wearied by life's burdens, oppressed by our own weakness, at those times when it is hard to keep going and loving seems impossible. In those moments, we need a powerful "jolt": The Holy Spirit, the power of God. In the Creed, we profess that he is the "giver of life". How good it would be for us each day to feel this jolt of life! To say when we wake up each morning: "Come, Holy Spirit, come into my heart, come into my day".
