Making Sense of Lenten Journey

It is once again the sacred season of Lent. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our Lenten spiritual and human journey as an individual and as a community. We received the ashes in the form of a cross on our foreheads. The ashes remind us of our sinfulness, vulnerability and woundedness. The cross on our foreheads assures us of the forgiving love and compassion of Jesus Christ to each one of us.

For those of us who grew up in a Catholic family and environment, we may recall that it was a common table conversation during Lent to talk about what do we give up. It could be no eating of meat on Fridays. Others would say they would give up alcohol or cigarettes. The conversation would tend to focus along this line of thought. I think we rarely shared the meaning of our traditional Lenten observances such as prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The question tends to be more pragmatic, self-centred and self-serving to make us feel good as Catholics. As we grow in maturity, age and faith, our questioning may challenge us to ask about the deeper meaning of Lenten and its religious observances.

As a spiritual leader of our local Church in Parramatta Diocese, Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen OFM Conv has reminded us of the central message of Lenten. He says that the heart of Lenten season is the task of metanoia that is "repenting of our sins and converting to the person and message of Christ" after we have strayed from the core values of the Gospel. It is a spiritual journey of interior renewal that invites us to "a change of heart, a change of attitude, a change in the way we relate to one another." It is a time of purification and renewal "to remove the heart of stone and to have the heart of flesh instead". Bishop Vincent further reflects by proclaiming that Lent is a time "we tell the truth about ourselves, our brokenness, our mortality, and nevertheless trust in God's redemptive love. We celebrate the gift of life with all its blessings and sorrows."

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We have the three pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The Church asks us to deepen our friendship and relationship with Jesus Christ through our prayer. Lent is a time to spend more quality time with God, a more intentional and more intense in our prayer and spiritual exercises. We are asked to do fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday only with the exemption of children, elderly and sick people. May fasting as a sacrifice lead us to self-mastery and closer union with Jesus Christ.

Almsgiving (in other words charity) calls us in solidarity with our suffering brothers and sisters. Charity makes us more aware of the sufferings and woundedness of so many families and communities who are desperate to survive and live normal lives. Our Lenten charity and generosity will change many people's lives.

May this reflection encourage us to bother in asking the deeper meaning of Lenten journey and observances.

May I conclude this reflection with the Lenten prayer from Catholic Relief Services (CRS).

Our Father,

As we begin Lent, let our hearts be filled with your Spirit so that we may grow deeper in your love.

May our prayer lead us to a sincere desire to be close to you.

May fasting help us rely on you and transform us into better people.

May our almsgiving be a chance to serve our one human family around the world.

Amen.
