### "NOT SEVEN, I TELL YOU, BUT SEVENTY-SEVEN TIMES."

Our Scripture readings for this Sunday remind us of God's unconditional love and mercy which calls us to walk the path of forgiveness and reconciliation. Psalm 102 tells us that God does not treat us "according to our sins" but instead crowns us with His love and compassion. The First Reading from the Book of Sirach summons us to show forgiveness and compassion for those who hurt us and not to nurse 'resentment and anger'.

The Gospel for this Sunday reveals to us once again the great and beautiful mystery of God's infinite mercy and forgiveness. God's boundless mercy and forgiveness is always offered to each of us. The call to forgive comes from the truth that God has always forgiven us.

The gospel comes from the concluding part of chapter 18 of Saint Matthew. This gospel has emphasized the importance of forgiveness as followers and disciples of Jesus Christ. The author of the gospel uses the image of the king who cancels and forgives the debt of his servant. The servant owes to the king a 'ten thousand talents' which denotes a huge amount of money that could mean billions of dollars in our present-day terms. Obviously the king is just, compassionate and forgiving, he rightly expects that, in turn, his servant will be so as well.

The king was so disappointed and angry to learn that the forgiven servant was so cruel and unforgiving to his fellow servant who only owed him a 'hundred denarii' (a few thousand dollars). The king shows extraordinary mercy in forgiving the debt. But the forgiven servant refuses to imitate his master's generosity towards another servant in the household in debt to him.

We receive so much mercy and forgiveness from the sacred and loving heart of Jesus in spite of our sinfulness and human failings. The call to forgive is sacred for we are personally forgiven by Christ himself, especially in the sacrament of penance.

God's boundless love and mercy enable us to forgive one another. But forgiving can be very hard and challenging for those who are close to us. Sometimes the hardest place to forgive is in our 'home' when a member of our family, a friend or a member of a community has hurt us deeply. It could take time to walk the path of forgiveness and reconciliation. May we have the grace and courage to forgive from the heart not only 'seven times but seventy-seven times'.

# + In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit **REFLECTION**

The Synod is a process of spiritual discernment, of ecclesial discernment, that unfolds in adoration, in prayer and in dialogue with the word of God. "God's word is "living and active, sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Heb 4:12). That word summons us to discernment and it brings light to that process. It guides the Synod, preventing it from becoming a Church convention, a study group or a political gathering, a parliament, but rather a grace-filled event, a process of healing guided by the Spirit. In these days, Jesus calls us, as he did the rich man in the Gospel, to empty ourselves, to free ourselves from all that is worldly, including our inward-looking and outworn pastoral models; and to ask ourselves what it is that God wants to say to us in this time. And the direction in which he wants to lead us.
