SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM FOR RECONCILIATION

Registration forms may be collected from the parish office from July 24.

The registration evening for the sacramental program will take place on Tuesday evening August 7 in the Parish Church. The classes for this program will take place on August 19, 26 and September 2. The reception of the sacrament will be offered on Saturday mornings September 15th and 22nd at 9:30am.

This is a parish based program which means it is open to parishioners of St Andrew the Apostle Parish Marayong. To be a parishioner means you either live in the parish boundaries or you have chosen this place as your place of involvement in the Church.

To be eligible, the candidates need to be at least in year two at school and have received the Sacrament of Baptism. Unfortunately, it has become necessary to point out that the registration evening and the classes are all compulsory if the candidates are to receive the sacrament. While it is understandable that legitimate reasons might prevent people from attending one of these occasions, what has become clear is that a number of families have failed to attend the required classes in our recent sacramental programs. The decision has now been taken that unless there is a legitimate reason, the candidates will not be eligible for the sacraments unless they complete the program. We do hope for your cooperation in this as it is to the obvious advantage of the candidates to receive the sacrament.

From Monsignor Ron ...

This weekend we have seen Paul referring to his "thorn in the flesh" about which we know absolutely nothing. Scripture scholars have spent ages trying to find out what this was all about. I personally think it is more valuable for us to consider our own thorn in the flesh, those things which prevent us from being better people and better Christians. There is no perfect person living in this world and we are all imperfect in many minor ways. At the same time, we all have one or more areas which cause us particular problems. I do believe it is important that we are honest about this to ourselves. Too often, we make excuses for ourselves. For example, when we go to confess our sins we might say we have been uncharitable and hurtful to others. We might repeat this every time we go to reconciliation. But are we honest enough with ourselves to look at the reason that this occurs so often in our lives. To me this is vitally important. It could be anger, unforgiveness, prejudice, greed, envy, or even fear or once again even something else. I believe if we are going to grow to our potential we need to be able to admit what is our underlying problem. I also believe that as in the case of St Paul, God will use our weaknesses to make us strong. After all, isn't this a key to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What do we do wrong? Why do we do it? What are we going to do with God's help to improve?

Today's gospel reading is very important to us. Jesus comes back to his hometown eager to share the power of God with the people and he is rejected. I wonder how often we do the same but not only in regard to God but also in regard to the people in our lives.

In regard to God, how often do we seek his advice on how to live our lives? How often do we seek healing

from him through the Sacraments, particularly through the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Penance?

In regard to the people in our lives we are often willing to take advice and criticism from strangers but at the same time resent it from amongst our relatives and friends and members of our families. The reality is that often the best people who can help us change for the better are the very people who are closest to us and know us the best.

Let us resolve to be always open to the invitations and interventions by our loving God and also in recognising the giftedness that every person we know brings into our lives.

The Scapular Is a Silent Prayer

As Our Lord taught us to say the Our Father, Our Blessed Mother taught us the value of the scapular. When we use it as a prayer, Our Lady draws us to the Sacred Heart of Her Divine Son. It is good, therefore, to hold the scapular in the hand. A prayer offered while holding the Scapular is as perfect as a prayer can be. It is especially in time of temptation that we need the powerful intercession of God's Mother. The evil spirit is utterly powerless when the wearer of a scapular faces temptation, calling upon the Holy Virgin in this silent devotion. "If you had recommended yourself to me, you would not have run into such danger," was Our Lady's gentle reproach to Blessed Alan de la Roche, one of her devoted servants.
