# SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM FOR RECONCILIATION

Registration forms may be collected from the parish office from July 24.



The registration evening for the sacramental program will take place on Tuesday evening August 7 in the Parish Church. The classes for this program will take place on August 19, 26 and September 2. The reception of the sacrament will be offered on Saturday mornings September 15th and 22nd at 9:30am.

This is a parish based program which means it is open to parishioners of St Andrew the Apostle Parish Marayong. To be a parishioner means you either live in the parish boundaries or you have chosen this place as your place of involvement in the Church.

To be eligible, the candidates need to be at least in year two at school and have received the Sacrament of Baptism.

Unfortunately, it has become necessary to point out that the registration evening and the classes are all compulsory if the candidates are to receive the sacrament. While it is understandable that legitimate reasons might prevent people from attending one of these occasions, what has become clear is that a number of families have failed to attend the required classes in our recent sacramental programs. The decision has now been taken that unless there is a legitimate reason, the candidates will not be eligible for the sacraments unless they complete the program. We do hope for your cooperation in this as it is to the obvious advantage of the candidates to receive the sacrament.

# From Monsignor Ron ...

The Lord is my Shepherd is one of the most beautiful Psalms and one that we should pray and reflect on very often. So many of the Psalm's images remind us of the life with God, a life of security, comfort, beauty, peace, and joy.

At the same time, we are presented with a realistic description of life in relationship to God. Such a life has times of gladness and overflowing joy. We also pass through difficult and stressful times as well. Our fundamental security throughout this life, which contains both light and dark, is God's commitment to us. In all the events of life he is with us, loving us. We are never alone.

To me, one of the marvellous points that the Psalm puts before us is that our God is our perfect companion who is with us every instant of our lives. This truth is of course beautifully exemplified in the Sacrament of Baptism and in Holy Communion where our God unites himself totally to us.

As well as being a loving and caring God, we are reminded that he is a concerned God who offers us perfect provision, perfect acceptance, perfect care, and the perfect destiny. He offers us perfect provision in that he gives us the means to survive today. He offers us perfect acceptance in that he will always love us and he will never reject us. He offers us perfect care because he loves us and wants to help us, and of course he always knows what is best for us. He offers us a perfect destiny in that he invites us to join him for eternal life.

In other words, we have a God who strives always to bring us to our full potential. This Psalm speaks to us about God's attitude to us. But, also, it calls us to love others and care for ourselves as he does for us; this means that it is a challenging Psalm as well.

In the Psalm we see the love of God for us and we see also his desire to support us. On our side, part of our response has to be to find plenty of space and time to be with our God.

In every generation the Lord has been our Good Shepherd. Today he speaks to us and asks us not just to be the recipients of his love and care, but also to see the large crowds of people in our own world who are like sheep without a shepherd. He asked us to have compassion for people who are lost and confused. He exhorts us to take responsibility in their regard and to set ourselves to be teachers to these people. But we need to remember that the Church is Shepherd for the world. Our loving God calls us his people to be effective signs of his love for every human person. We need to constantly be asking ourselves how can we show the care of Christ to the people we meet today?

# Prayer for the Sick

Father of goodness and love, hear our prayers for the sick members of our community and for all who are in need. Amid mental and physical suffering may they find consolation in your healing presence. Show your mercy as you close wounds, cure illness, make broken bodies whole and free downcast spirits. May these special people find lasting health and deliverance, and so join us in thanking you for all your gifts. We ask this through the Lord Jesus who healed those who believed. Amen.
