From Monsignor Ron ...

On our journey to Christmas this year, this weekend we are invited to prepare a way for the Lord who comes to us. It is a call to make time to rejoice in God's love for us but also to make a daily effort to try and make our hearts worthy to meet him.

In our reading from St Paul this weekend, we have seen Paul praying that the Christians will grow into the wisdom of "recognising what is best." When you think about it this is a great gift and is very similar to the Gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation which we call "counsel" or right judgement. In ordinary life and particularly when we are struggling in life and are experiencing conflicts, it requires great wisdom to recognise what is best. I like to see this gift or power that we have received not just in the context of making decisions between right and wrong, but rather trying to discover the most loving thing to do or way to respond in every particular situation of daily life.

This message is reinforced by John the Baptist which is all about preparing a way for the Lord. To build a straight path does not mean avoiding what is in front of us, but it is as John the Baptist says undertaking "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." To repent and to undertake a journey of repentance means being totally honest with ourselves and acknowledging our sinfulness, facing up to our weaknesses and failures. Once we have done this, we need to acknowledge that we can be forgiven and that God's love is greater than our sins. This is great source of confidence and strength.

We know the good news of God's love for us. We know the message that Jesus has brought to us on how to live our lives. As the prophet Baruch teaches us it is now time to walk in freedom. Of course, we

need to walk the straight path ourselves, but strengthened by the life of Jesus and the grace of our God, we should be prepared to take the initiative in loving, and goodness and kindness to all we meet. Certainly, our feast of Christmas is all about the reality of our loving God's attitude to us and our response should be to be loving people in the way we approach each and every person who passes through our life. Surely there is no better way that we can prepare for this coming feast than growing in at least one way as loving people.
