From Monsignor Ron ...

Our God wishes us to be happy. What we are taught is that we will be happy with God's strength and vitality if we follow the way that God points out to us. Jeremiah, this weekend, helps us to understand this by telling us the path to happiness is trusting in the Lord. He put it very poetically by saying that such a person is like a tree planted beside running water. In other words, we will have all the nourishment and strength we need to grow to our potential if we do place our trust fully in the Lord.

We can carry this idea even further because we know water is necessary for all living things. In the same way, God and God's grace is necessary for our survival and growth to our potential. We see in this an image of our Baptism which uses a symbol of water to signify our reception of the new life given to us, making us members of God's family and giving us the gifts of faith, hope, and charity. We should also recognise the importance in this context of our celebration of Mass. Each time we come to Mass we have nourishment for the life of God within us through the Word of Scripture and through our union with Jesus in Holy Communion.

This weekend we also have St Luke's presentation of the Beatitudes. There is an important message for all of us and guidelines on trusting Jesus for his values. We do tend to be materialistic people who attach great importance to the good things in life so much so that wealth can become like a "God" or idol that we worship and build our lives around. What Jesus says to us is that this is making the wrong choice simply because placing worldly prosperity before our relationship with God will never lead to lasting happiness. Certainly, we do have a right to

good living conditions and good material security. The problem comes when these are the most important things in our daily lives. If we are only focused on ourselves and our own comfort it is difficult to see how we can be receptive to the needs of others and how we can grow as loving people. I say this because to be a loving person means to be other centred rather than self-centred.

What is important for all of us to realise is the absolute priority of our relationship with God which needs to find expression each and every day in our philosophy of life and in our way of living. We are to love God and express this all the time and part of this needs to be appreciation of the gift of ourselves to the world in which we live and that appreciation of the dignity and value of each and every person.

There will be a morning tea after this Mass and we encourage people to join us for this. They may also see this as an opportunity to bring along a plate with some finger food on it. Our parish seniors group organise the morning tea and we very much appreciate their commitment in this regard.


