From Monsígnor Ron ...

We are all on a journey we began on Ash Wednesday. This is a journey of conversion and renewal. Too often, we make the mistake of seeing conversion as a person making a journey from one fief to another. While this is true, it does not tap into the fullness of what conversion is about. Every one of us is on a journey in the process of conversion each and every day of our lives. The Lenten season is a time of particular commitment to this process of conversion, making a new start, and ensuring that our lives are balanced and in perspective.

For this to truly happen it demands a daily commitment from each one of us. In this season of Lent this means a commitment to more prayer, the practice of self-denial, and the exercise of love and concern for other people. However, our own efforts are not sufficient to make this a successful journey where at Easter, when we renew our Baptismal Promises, it will be something meaningful, wonderful and life changing. What will make this a successful journey is to follow the advice given by the Father in today's gospel when he tells us we must listen to Jesus.

I suspect that in many cases we just assume we are doing this and continue to drift along rather complacently. Secondly, as St Paul reminds us we also fall into the trap of thinking that the really important things in life are the things of this world. This can be very dangerous. On the one hand we are claiming to believe that God is the meaning of our lives, but our daily living does not reflect this. If God is truly the meaning of our lives, this will be reflected in our attitudes, our values, our actions and our way of life. For example, through his Church we are being told that this Season of Lent is a time for a special effort. I would suggest we look back over the past 12 days since we began this journey and see if it has truly been for us a special time in our relationship with God and with each other.

On this Sunday we are asked to reflect on the importance of the Transfiguration. The Transfiguration teaches us the meaning of the mystery of death and resurrection. We learn that the glorification of Jesus was to be achieved in his case through suffering and death. But as well, it is also a glimpse for us of the wonderful gift of eternal life that our loving God wishes to give to us. We are preparing for a transformed, glorified life with our God. This is the focus we need to keep as we continue this journey to Easter.

Monday, March 18: This year we celebrate the **Feast of St Patrick** the day after the actual feast day. St Patrick is one of the patron saints of our country and a tremendous reminder unselect us of what person can accomplish in their lives. We need to remember that we have been empowered by Jesus Christ to be his missionaries to every person we meet.

Tuesday, March 19: We celebrate the **Feast of St Joseph, husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. This is a wonderful occasion to pray for family life and in particular for our own families. We should use this occasion to seek the help of Mary and St Joseph in guiding us on how to live in a family situation with each other and with the children in the family. We should also pray on this occasion for a parish community which is also our larger family to which we belong that we may always be gentle with each other and caring towards each other.

Reflection on the Mass

Every time we come to Mass, we come to pray with Jesus; we come to pray the prayer he prayed at the Last Supper, which was the First Mass. This is the first thing we need to remember about the Mass -- we are praying with Jesus. Today something wonderful is going to happen for you and it will happen each time you come to Mass in the future. Jesus gives himself to us in Holy Communion. Because he wants to be as close to us as possible, he took bread and wine and changed this into himself so he could always be with us in this very special way.

There is another point that Jesus wants us to be aware of -- we are not just on the receiving end, getting these wonderful gifts; we also have certain responsibilities. We need to remember that we are all members of one family. So, if I am united to Jesus when I receive Holy Communion and you our united to Jesus when you receive Holy Communion, then we are united to each other. This means you can show how much we love Jesus and God our Father by the way we treat each other. We also show our love by the efforts we make to be like Jesus.
