Sacramental Program for Confirmation

This year the Sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated on Tuesday, June 18 and Wednesday June 19 in St Andrew the Apostle Parish.



To be eligible to receive this sacrament, candidates need to have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation and made their First Holy Communion. As well, candidates need to be in at least year 5. Since this is a parish based program, the candidates should be registered as parishioners of this parish. Registration forms are available to be collected from the parish office from Monday now up until the registration evening for parents which will take place in our Parish Church on Tuesday, May 14 at 7:00pm. This meeting is compulsory.

The four classes will take place over two Sundays, May 26 and June 2. To be eligible to receive a sacrament it is necessary that all these meetings be attended. If there is a particular difficulty, please talk to our sacramental coordinator via the parish office.

From Monsignor Ron ...

This Sunday is called "Good Shepherd Sunday." This is so because we have Jesus saying: "The sheep that belong to me, listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me." (John 10:27-30). We have Jesus inviting us to follow him and this means being prepared to take up our cross each day. Of course, we would assume that we are at least trying to be followers of the Lord as we are striving to be Christians.

This weekend is also Vocations Sunday. We are called to pray for vocations to the priesthood. As a priest, I know how much I owed to the prayers of others as I considered whether or not I had a vocation to priesthood. Needless to say, the need for the support and prayers of people continues and will continue every day. So this weekend we are asked to pray that those who are called to priesthood will accept the call and we are also asked to commit ourselves to praying not only for vocations, but also for those preparing for priesthood and those people who are already our priests. I guess this is particularly important in this age in which we live.

A vocation, or a call, is something we receive from God. It is not a career. It is a call in which God enables us to fulfil our calling even in the most difficult circumstances. But we need to realise is that God calls each one of us personally by name. And since God calls us personally by name, we are the only people who can respond to that call. We are invited to respond with our own talents and abilities and even with our own shortcomings and limitations. Since each one of us is unique, our response to God's call will be unique. Our response will not be better or worse than others but just uniquely

different. The reason I say this is that every call is a call to live in faith. We have been gifted to this world as God special gifts with a special task in helping people to come to know Jesus and to grow to their full God-given potential. I believe it is important for us to accept this for ourselves because unless we accept that each of us has a special calling from God, we will never create an environment for priestly vocations or for vocations to the religious life.

This weekend reminds us how each one of us is very special as well as being unique and that we are not in this world by accident. We are here because in this moment of time we can make the greatest contribution in the eyes of God. Today I would ask you to have a deeper faith in our loving God and to look for how each of us may surrender our lives more fully to him.

Prayer for Vocations

O God, Father of all Mercies, Provider of a bountiful Harvest, send Your Graces upon those You have called to gather the fruits of Your labor preserve and strengthen them in their lifelong service of you.

Open the hearts of Your children that they may discern Your Holy Will; inspire in them a love and desire to surrender themselves to serving others in the name of Your son, Jesus Christ.

Teach all Your faithful to follow their respective paths in life guided by Your Divine Word and Truth. Through the intercession of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, all the Angels, and Saints, humbly hear our prayers and grant Your Church's needs, through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
