From Monsignor Ron ...

I remember a few years ago listening to a talk on what is called the new evangelisation which had people reflecting on what was the most effective way for Christians to spread their faith amongst others. Of course, everybody came up with the idea of using all the techniques of modern advertising to persuade people that what we believe is worth sharing. It was pointed out that we live in a world that is sick and tired of hearing more and more words which seem to actually go nowhere. The lecturer stated that the most effective means of evangelisation is martyrdom. I am not convinced that many people were taken with this answer which seems to include dying for our faith. However, the point was being made was an important one – one of the central teachings of Christianity is the need to back up our words with our actions which is what Jesus meant when he told us to take up our cross and follow him.

We also have Jesus telling his disciples and us that we all have to suffer for our faith. It is on occasions such as this that we need to be a witness to our faith and as Jesus tells us, "Your endurance will win you your lives."

I must admit it is very unlikely that we will be called to actually die for our faith, but we are certainly called to live our faith in all the events of daily life. And that is going to be difficult. It will mean that we have to get rid of all forms of selfishness and self-centredness and rather become God centred people. By this I mean that we need to seek God's will in all situations and also to strive to discover how Jesus would act in every situation and towards every person. This is only going to happen through our

commitment to our faith. We do need to realise and express in practice that God is the centre of the universe and not us.

Now is the time to try to live practical Christian lives each and every day; this means we need to make efforts to correct the faults we have, efforts to prevent further faults from occurring, and it also means that we have to develop the talents and abilities God has given to us. None of these will happen automatically so it requires planning and practical action.

Jesus came to show us a vision of a life that never ends. We began to live this life at Baptism and Jesus offers to increase this life every moment for us. However, if this is going to happen, he asks us to stay focused on our eternal destiny and to accept that a true meaning in life will not be found only in this world. The reality is we have been created so that we may know him and live with him now and always.

Since we are very good at making excuses for ourselves in regard to our spiritual lives, each year at this time we are reminded of the importance of looking at how we are living as Christians and at practical ways that we can improve.

MASS FOR THE SICK On November 23, next Saturday at 9:00am we celebrate our Mass with the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. What I would like to stress is that first of all this is an encounter, a meeting with Jesus, for this, after all, is the very definition of a sacrament. The second point that I would like to make is that God always heals, but he does not always do this in the way that we expect. If you know somebody who is experiencing serious illness, preparing for an operation, or suffering the infirmity of old age, we encourage you to invite them and if necessary to bring them along to this Mass.

This is also a wonderful opportunity to pray for people we know who are experiencing illness. There will be a morning tea after the Mass, so please bring along a plate for this.

Parish and Diocesan Finances

There are a number of points that we would like to bring to your attention.

1. As you are aware, the first collection taken up each Sunday goes to the Diocese. It is from this that the stipends for our priests are paid as well as the normal housekeeping expenses incurred by parishes. Across the Diocese this has been slowly decreasing and we would ask that parishioners consider their contribution to this collection.
2. The second collection taken up each weekend is for the ongoing support in running expenses of the parish. You constantly see the benefits of this in the developments around the parish and in the maintenance that is carried out. Then of course there are the running costs of this whole complex which is something we are all used to in our household expenses. These are increasing. We continue to appreciate the generosity of parishioners who subscribe to the envelopes, use direct debit, or contribute with cash as these things are essential to the upkeep, maintenance and development of our parish community.
3. There is still one area that seems to be becoming more prevalent. One of the things that has become obvious in recent years is that many people have gotten out of the habit of carrying cash with them. With this in mind it has been suggested that we put in a **"tap and go"** for credit cards near the front door of the Church. We have decided on a limit of \$5 so if people prefer to offer more than that, it would require tapping the unit twice or whatever number of times. We do hope that people will use this opportunity to support the parish. Proposed to begin in December.
