From Monsignor Ron ...

On this feast day of Christ the King we acknowledge Jesus Christ as a universal Lord and King. In doing this we are committing ourselves as followers of Jesus Christ to help build up the kingdom of God. Today's feast was introduced by Pope Pius XI in 1925. It was a time of great stress in the world. The Pope reminded the world that there is ultimately only one real ruler: God. God made his rule most clear in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. As Pope Pius XI said, when we all recognise "both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last received the great blessings of real liberty, well ordered discipline, peace and harmony."

Normally when we think about kings and queens, we picture castles and crowns, jewels, pomp and ceremony. This is somewhat different than the image presented this weekend for our reflection and consideration. We have the story of how Jesus Christ died on the cross. So, whatever kind King he is, he is nothing like our human expectations of one. His throne was a cross; his crown was made of thorns, his courtiers were his executioners, and the people closest to him were common criminals. But even in this there is an important message. He is one who cares for us right to the end and he cares enough to suffer and die. He cares enough to be misunderstood and rejected. He cares enough to seem a failure. He is a King who cares and is prepared to make any sacrifice for the sake of those he loves.

As his followers we are asked to be like him. What this means in practice is looking out for others, taking

care of the weak and the poor, those without hope for the future, and those without any real sense of their own value and worth as people created by God.

There is a wonderful prayer which says: "Christ has no hands but our hands to do his work today, no feet but our feet to lead the people in his ways, no tongue but our tongue to tell them how he died, and no help but our help to bring people to his side."

It seems to me that our mission as members of God's family, which we are, is to offer people the love of God. We are invited to show people in practical ways how loving and merciful our God is. When we are prepared to do this we are living up to the consequences of our baptism part of which was to be Christ's body, his presence in the world.

TAP AND GO GIVING:

One of the things that has become obvious in recent years is that many people have gotten out of the habit of carrying cash with them. With this in mind it has been suggested that we put in a "tap and go" for credit cards near the front door of the Church. We have decided on a limit of \$5 so if people prefer to offer more than that, it would require tapping the unit twice or whatever number of times. We do hope that people will use this opportunity to support the parish. It is proposed to begin this in December.

THE SEASON OF ADVENT:

Next weekend we begin the journey to Christmas in the season of Advent. I encourage you to use these weeks as an opportunity to renew your commitment to Jesus and prepare to welcome him more fully into your lives at Christmas.
