### ATTENDANCE AT MASS:

For your information – currently the 5 PM Mass reaches capacity. The 6 PM Mass could allow for 20 to 30 more people. The 7:30 AM Mass is usually close to capacity. The 8:30 AM Mass can usually take 20 to 30 more people. The remaining Masses are usually full to capacity.

### **CORONAVIRUS UPDATE:**

As you are aware, we are **limited to 100\* people in the Church** for any liturgical celebration or at any one time. \*From September 14, up to 150 people are now allowed to attend a <u>wedding service</u> at a place of public worship. **Social distancing** and the 4 square metre per person **(1.5m physical distancing)** requirements are still in place.

### DIRECTIVES:

### All people who are coming into the church are to wear a mask.

Due to the limit there can be no gathering outside the church before, during or after our services.

To assist staff and volunteers in policing these regulations:

Weekday morning mass - 9.00am Monday to Saturday.

Entry by using the side door for entry to the church and the door behind the choir area for exit. Sunday Masses:

Entry by using the area behind the choir door to the church and the door near the piety store for exit.

### PLEASE HELP US KEEP OUR PARISHIONERS AND VISITORS TO THE CHURCH SAFE.

Please follow instructions upon entry to the Church. • If you are unwell, stay home as the dispensation from Sunday Mass is still current. (Live streaming of 9:30am Mass is still available); • Use hand sanitizer; • When entering Church, sign in; • Sit in designated spots and • Keep your distance when lining up for Holy Communion.

Breach of any of these orders referenced under the Public Health Act is a criminal offence and can attract penalties.

As has occurred in some parishes, we expect police may conduct random inspections of places of worship for COVID-19 safety compliance.

## From Monsignor Ron ...

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he left his Church with a seemingly impossible task -- to go out to all nations, to preach the gospel to all people, and to Baptise. The Church at that stage was a few Apostles and some disciples, yet they were incredibly successful in their mission. The key to their success was twofold: the Holy Spirit was able to work through them; he was able to do this because they were the type of people who really lived out what they believed and who accepted this mission that Jesus gave them.

As St Paul tells us they showed their faith in action in that their faith affected every aspect of their lives. They worked for love, so that in all things they did what God wanted and they appreciated the value and worth of each person. They persevered through hope, in that they realized friendship with God was the goal of life; as a result, all within their lives was part of their preparation to live with him forever.

Today the Church has the same mission as when it began. Yet, in many ways, the Church is not having a great impact on society. In fact, as far as practicing the faith is concerned we seem at times to be going backwards. Many people have come up with many reasons for this -- what is interesting is that it is always someone else who is to blame.

I think the answer is very simple: We are the Church. We have this mission from Jesus. Every baptized person, not just the priests and the religious, but each one of us is called to be a missionary of Jesus. We are called to be missionaries through our prayers, by our example in Christian living, and by our active involvement with people.

St Paul praised the people for their efforts at Christian living. Would he praise us? Do we deserve praise for the place we give God in our daily living? Do we deserve praise for our Christian living -- would people see it as a burden to us or as the most important aspect of life? Do we deserve praise for making the things of God more important than anything else? Do we deserve praise for the love we have for each other?

### GETTING ALONG WITH OTHERS

- 1. Watch your thoughts. Think about what you're thinking about. I often think things about other people, judging them, without even realizing it. I'm going to work on paying more attention to my thoughts and do my best to push them in a non-judgmental, more accepting direction.
- 2. Look for the positive. Not accepting others is a result of seeing the negative in them. Instead of focusing on why someone is different, I'm going to focus on what's good about that person and his/her choices and actions. My way is not always the best one.
- 3. Avoid right/wrong dichotomies. It's very tempting to see the world in black and white with a right and wrong way to do things, but that's just not how it is. Things don't have to be right or wrong if I choose to accept them as they are. I'm going to stop labeling my way as "right."
- 4. Stop judging yourself. Our judgments of others are often a result of our personal criticisms. If I stop putting pressure on myself to do things the "right" way, I'll also stop putting pressure on others as well. Not judging myself or others is a crucial step to acceptance.
- 5. Focus on the now. A lack of acceptance can generate from comparing things to the past. I'm not going to think about what happened before and try to live accordingly; I'm going to think about now. Comparing things to the past always hinders an acceptance of what is.

  Reverse the situation. I ask myself: What if someone were judging me and not accepting me? How would I feel? I'll keep these questions in mind the next time I'm not accepting others. I will imagine someone constantly telling me to slow down (and how annoying that would be!).

### November Masses for the Faithful Departed

November is a special time to pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a church on November 2 and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions.

During the month of November Masses are prayed for the faithful departed. The names of these people for whom Masses are requested are placed on the wall of the Church. November Mass Offering Envelopes are available at the doors of the Church. The usual offering is \$20.

You are requested to print the name of the deceased so that it will be easily read.
