ST VINCENT DEPAUL CHRISTMAS APPEAL 2020:

I am writing about this now as there have already been some requests for information on what will happen this year.

As we are all aware this is a very different year and this will necessitate some changes in the ways that we support families in need at Christmas. It is our usual custom to have the Jesse Tree, but this is somewhat impractical in this current coronavirus period of time. There have been some concerns expressed by scientific bodies about too many people handling packages and parcels and we do need to take that into account.

What is vital is that we help, through the St Vincent DePaul Society, families who have special needs at Christmas. The practical solution we have come up with is that we are asking people that instead of buying gifts for children of different ages and for families, that instead we give them gift cards that they can use at Woolworths, Coles, IGA, Big W et cetera. In this regard, we will need your support.

If you're able to help, you are requested to hand in the gift cards to the parish office or at Mass on weekends.

It is planned that these will be delivered over the weekend beginning December 12.

From Monsignor Ron ...

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we are being asked to reflect upon our lives and how we are going. The point that is being made is that we will have to give an accounting of our life in this world at the end of this journey before we begin our eternal journey. The important questions will be: Have I made a success of my life? Have I served the Lord well? Have I been growing to my God-given potential? It would be very handy to know when we will have to give an accounting of our lives, but that is not being realistic. As St Paul tells us, if we live our lives wisely, we will not be caught out.

So, what is living our lives wisely all about? I would suggest it is living our lives each day as if we would have to answer those questions listed above today. To use clichés, the past is past and the future is totally unknown, so all we have is the present moment and it is important that we make the most of these opportunities as they present themselves each day.

Our gospel parable this weekend is about a wealthy man who entrusts talents to three of his servants. The moral of the story could hardly be clearer and that is that this life is enormously important. How we live it and what we make of it will decide our future.

One of the things that I do like about this story of Jesus is the teaching that we are all specially gifted people and I see in this a reminder that each of us has been created as a unique act of creation by our loving God with tremendous potential and as one of his necessary gifts to the world in which we live. Yet, in spite of this, too many of us think that we are not very important. This is simply not true and the success of our lives is expressed by making the most of the gifts and talents that make us uniquely ourselves. I said that we are one of God's necessary gifts to the world and I say this because we all have a vital role to play in God's plan for the world and it is in fulfilling that role that we grow to our potential, developing our gifts and becoming loving people after the example of Jesus himself.

It is not important whether or not we are in the limelight or whether the world regards us as important people. What is important is that we accept that we are loved for who we are by the God who made us and that we are in fact important in the continuation of the work of Jesus Christ. So long as we are genuinely trying to love and serve the Lord in the daily events of life, our lives are going to be successful in the eyes of God. As long as we are prepared to try each day we can be confident that our Lord will be there to welcome us at the end of our lives and walk with us into eternal life.

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS on the

FOURTH WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

(extract)

"Stretch forth your hand to the poor" (*Sir* 7:32). Age-old wisdom has proposed these words as a sacred rule to be followed in life. Today these words remain as timely as ever. They help us fix our gaze on what is essential and overcome the barriers of indifference. Poverty always appears in a variety of guises and calls for attention to each particular situation. In all of these, we have an opportunity to encounter the Lord Jesus, who has revealed himself as present in the least of his brothers and sisters (cf. *Mt* 25:40).



This year's theme – "Stretch forth your hand to the poor" – is thus a summons to responsibility and commitment as men and women who are part of our one human family. It encourages us to bear the burdens of the weakest, in accord with the words of Saint Paul: "Through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'... Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ" (*Gal* 5:13-14; 6:2). The Apostle teaches that the freedom bestowed through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ makes us individually responsible for serving others, especially the weakest. This is not an option, but rather a sign of the authenticity of the faith we profess.

DIRECTIVES:

All people coming to Mass are to wear a mask.

Please help with sanitising the seats at the conclusion of Mass.



OTHER MATTERS - Please remember: if you are unwell do not come to the Church.

There is to be no congregational singing during Worship Services.

Mingling and social gatherings in the outdoor area should also not occur after the Mass as this would be considered an outdoor social gathering and would impact on the Mass that is following.

Weekday morning Masses will continue to be live streamed. The same will happen at the 9:30 AM Mass on Sunday morning. Entry to the Church:

For weekday Masses: this will be via the side door closest to the Parish Offices.

For Vigil and Sunday Masses: entry will be via the door facing Breakfast Road. When and if the church reaches its capacity we will open the area to the piazza to allow the designated people to be seated outside.
