*From Monsignor Ron ...* At the second Vatican Council there was written:

"Our understanding of Christian living must be renewed. This demands the return to Scripture. There we will discover the nobility of our baptismal vocation in Christ and a consequent obligation to live in love for the life of the world."

What does your baptism mean to you? Do you see it as an event only? If so, bad luck! You have missed the point. You have also probably wasted your life.

Today is the day of your baptism. Every moment and in every situation, you are celebrating and living your baptism. If you are not striving to do this, then it looks as though Jesus wasted his time coming to meet you and touch you on the occasion that you were baptized.

The way we choose to respond to the call of every situation is the way we respond to Jesus. St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians says we must live in a manner worthy of the call we have received. To live in Christ Jesus every day, through the grace of our baptism, is, in every way, to be a Catholic.

The onus is on us to assume full membership in the family of God. In the case of baptism, however, it does not become fully effective until, at some future date, we personally decide that, yes, this is what we really want. We cannot go on living on a promise made for me by someone else. The time must come when we take ownership of that decision.

What we need to realise is that our baptism was not just some nice social event. It was and is a work of God. It defines who we are: a Christian. It describes how we live following Jesus. Our baptism challenges us to be true to our calling. It challenges us to follow Jesus daily with the help of the Spirit, to live every day to the glory of the Father, to live every day as a member of the Church, thus, to be a Catholic.

To be a Catholic is to seek to become fully human. As St. Irenaeus said in the early church, "the glory of God is the human person fully alive." It is Jesus, as human, who helps us to become ever more human, and thus to discover the mystery of our calling to share divine life.

## AN INVITATION CONCERNING YOUR INVOLVEMENT IN OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

As we move into a new year it is important to consider what contribution we can make to the parish community. We are grateful for the many people who have already committed themselves but there are so many yet to do so and we would ask these people to consider becoming involved in the parish.

We are a parish family, and it is hoped that all of us will contribute in so far as we are able to do so to building up this family and community.

Some of the areas where we might like to become involved:

- **Liturgy:** Reader, Minister of Communion, Altar Server, Warden, Welcomer.
- **Sacramental Programs:** Preparation for Baptism, Reconciliation Communion, Confirmation.
- **General Areas:** Church Cleaning, Property Maintenance, Counters for Finance, Parish Pastoral Council.
- **Parish Groups and Ministries:** St Vincent DePaul Society, Social Justice Group, Legion of Mary (adults and juniors), H JM Prayer Community, Couples for Christ, Lenten discussion/reflection groups.

**Ongoing Faith Formation:** this is very open and we would welcome suggestions from parishioners on what areas they would like to have faith formation.

### VOLUNTEERS REQUIRED

*We are in need of extra helpers in a number of areas. They are as follows:*

- people who might be available to help on a Sunday morning with sorting the collections.
- Volunteers to be involved in the baptism preparation program which would entail a couple of hours once every couple of months. Training and preparation will be provided.
- Acolytes to help with the baptismal ceremonies which are currently taking place weekly. The more volunteers we have the easier will be the commitment on these people.

#### **Pope Francis:**

#### **Patris corde**

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.

The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of St Joseph," beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021..

#### **Extract from Apostolic Letter on year of St Joseph**

"Get up, take the child and his mother" (Mt 2:13), God told Saint Joseph. The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and his zeal. Indeed, the proper mission of the saints is not only to obtain miracles and graces, but to intercede for us before God, like Abraham[26] and Moses[27], and like Jesus, the "one mediator" (1 Tim 2:5), who is our "advocate" with the Father (1 Jn 2:1) and who "always lives to make intercession for [us]" (Heb 7:25; cf. Rom 8:34). The saints help all the faithful "to strive for the holiness and the perfection of their particular state of life".[28] Their lives are concrete proof that it is possible to put the Gospel into practice.

Jesus told us: "Learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart" (Mt 11:29). The lives of the saints too are examples to be imitated. Saint Paul explicitly says this: "Be imitators of me!" (1 Cor 4:16).[29] By his eloquent silence, Saint Joseph says the same. Before the example of so many holy men and women, Saint Augustine asked himself: "What they could do, can you not also do?" And so he drew closer to his definitive conversion, when he could exclaim: "Late have I loved you, Beauty ever ancient, ever new!"[30] We need only ask Saint Joseph for the grace of graces: our conversion.
