From Monsignor Ron ...

What we see in our first reading this week from the Acts of the Apostles is how the Holy Spirit influenced the early followers of Jesus. What happened was that they reorganise their lives so that they might be able to offer one another love and support as they faced the problems that came their way, not individually, but as a community. We see how they constantly helped each other and especially so when a person or a family was in need. I find this reminiscent of what happens in our parish at Christmas time, when we provide the means for the St Vincent DePaul Society to reach out to families and individuals in need. I do think though that we have to take it a little bit further and make sure that we are supportive of each and every one of our parish family. In fact, we can take it even further and that means being loving and caring for every person we encounter in our journey of life.

What I see happening after the resurrection of Jesus among the apostles is a great commitment to act with loving concern for each other. The reality is we are all members of one family for we are all created by God and created to be loving people. If we truly believe this, we need to treat every person we encounter as family and in doing this, I believe, we will grow towards our potential and in our relationship with our God.

This weekend we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. It does raise the question of just how much our God loves us. Yet the reality is many of us do not believe that God loves us personally for we believe that we are unworthy and have not lived up to what God has asked of us. This is understandable as it is the way the world in which we live works. For example, if you ignore someone, they ignore you. If you oppose someone, they oppose you. It is here that I think Thomas, the apostle, is very important to us. It is possible that the problem that Thomas had was in believing that Jesus could forgive him for his lack of faith and failure to live up to his potential. I like to think that what impacted on Thomas was the realisation of just how loving and merciful our God is to each and every one of us. I would also like to hope that God's mercy and love for us will be reflected in our approach to every person we meet.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY



In celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday, the faithful are called to reflect more personally on the graces won through the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. In this way their hearts may be more fully aware of the mercy of God for them personally and for the sake of the world

LET US PRAY: For those who have become lukewarm and indifferent Most Compassionate Jesus, You are Compassion Itself. I bring lukewarm souls into the abode of Your Most Compassionate Heart. In this fire of Your pure love let these tepid souls, who like corpses, filled You with such deep loathing, be once again set aflame. O Most Compassionate Jesus, exercise the omnipotence of Your mercy and draw them into the very ardour of Your love, and bestow upon them the gift of holy love, for nothing is beyond Your power.

Eternal Father turn Your merciful gaze upon lukewarm souls, who are nonetheless enfolded in the Most Compassionate Heart of Jesus. Father of Mercy, I beg You by the bitter Passion of Your Son and by His threehour agony on the Cross: Let them, too, glorify the abyss of Your mercy.

Sacramental program for first Holy Communion

This program will be commencing shortly after the beginning of the 2nd term of the scholastic year. When schools recommence, the registration forms will be available from the parish office. This program is for children in year 3 and above who have received the sacrament of Reconciliation.

The registration forms may be collected from the parish office starting on Monday 19th of April 2021. The registration evening will take place on Tuesday May 4th, 2021, at 7 PM in the Church. The events of this evening are for parents only. It is not for the children. Under the current legislation, those entering the church will have to sign in.

The classes will be held on the weekends of May 22-23 and May 29-30. Precisely how this will happen in practice will be explained at the parent night when we are clearer on what the rules are for Covid 19 in New South Wales.

The dates for First Holy Communion are currently scheduled for June 5 & 6 (so long as there is no tightening of restrictions). Currently, we are planning on having a 12 noon Mass at which we should be able to accommodate approximately 28 candidates. There would be a cap on the number of family members able to attend. It is planned that the other candidates would go to one of the other Masses on that weekend. Of course, there would be limited numbers at each Mass and we would probably include the 9 am Saturday morning Mass.

We will have an update on the current financial situation in the parish and what has been happening and will happen in regard to major maintenance works that are necessary at this time.

We also encourage all those involved in the Parish Pastoral Council to talk with people around the parish to ascertain what they see are the needs for all of us at this time. We do need representatives from every organisation, ministry and group in the parish to participate at these meetings.

Role of a Pastoral Council

A Pastoral Council consists of the Pastor together with a group of parishioners chosen by the parish community. The Pastoral Council's role is to promote the Church's mission to live and communicate the love and values of Christ in our world. The Pastoral Council shares in the responsibility for the ongoing life and development of the faith community, working together with parishioners to provide support for their efforts to live as followers of Christ.

Functions of a Pastoral Council A Pastoral Council seeks to:

* Enrich the quality of parish life.

In order to fulfill its role, the Pastoral Council will:

- *Search out and respond to the hopes, ideas, needs and concerns of parishioners.
- *Grow in knowledge and awareness of what is already happening in the parish.
- *Encourage and support the good work of existing groups within the parish.
- *Evaluate carefully information gathered in order to contribute towards the making of decisions that reflect the values of the gospel and the teachings of the Church.
- **★**Set long-term and short-term pastoral goals for the parish.
- **★**Provide opportunities for parishioners to grow in their relationship with God and with each other.
- *Develop, implement & improve parish initiatives to assist parishioners' continuing efforts to live as effective Christians in society.

By way of explanatory note, pastoral issues, the core concern of the Parish Pastoral Council, are those that impact on the life of parishioners in the areas of:

- *Integration of their faith into everyday life home, work, community.
- *Nourishment and support of their faith as they strive to live as faithful disciples of Jesus.
- *Outward focus for the development of an alive Christian community, actively engaged in Jesus' mission of service and influence in the wider world.
