From Monsignor Ron ...

Our first reading this weekend is taken from the Acts of the Apostles and I think it contains one of the most important teachings that we will ever learn and it is also one that St Peter needed to learn. To put it very simply, God does not have favourites. Everyone is totally and unconditionally loved by God. Everyone who does what is right is acceptable to God and there are no dividing lines of separate us from one another. We might remember from the Sermon on the Mount that Jesus told us that not even our enemies are to be treated differently. In fact he went even further when he told us to love our enemies and to do good to those who treat us badly.

A few weeks ago, when we celebrated Holy Week, at the Mass of the Lord's Supper we had Jesus giving us the commandment to love one another as he has loved us. What is being emphasised here is that being loving is a response to God loving us first and following his example with his help we are to love others. In other words, it is because we are loved by our God that we are able to reach out into love to others. In fact, the love of God shown us in Jesus should inspire us to love others and in that to have no exceptions.

I would go so far as to say that our Christian vocation is to become more and more deeply loving people. To me this is the focus of the teachings of Jesus. As we have been told often enough our hearts were made for God and we will never find what we are looking for until being a person full of love we are connected fully to our God. In this, it is important to remember we are in the presence of God in every moment through every person we meet, through every experience we have, and in every situation we find ourselves. So, it seems to me that if we want to have a vibrant relationship with our God and if we want to have constant contact with him we need to be loving people.

Finally, being a Christian finds expression in our whole way of life. It is based on a deep gratitude for having received the gift of faith and it also involves an eagerness to share that gift with others.

Sacramental Program for First Holy Communion

We have now commenced the program to prepare more of our young people to receive Holy Communion. I do encourage parishioners during this time to pray for their intentions and also the intentions of their families. I also believe that a time like this provides good motivation for us to reflect on the importance of the Mass and our reception of Holy Communion.



A **Reflection...** I suspect that the sin which most commonly afflicts us and is not much mentioned in spiritual literature is wrath, that is, anger and hatred. I venture to say that most of us operate, however unconsciously, out of anger and this shows itself in our constant criticism of others, in our cynicism, in our jealousy of others, in our bitterness, and in our inability to praise others. And unlike most of our other sins, anger is easy to camouflage and rationalize as virtue.

But our unhappy cynicism isn't the biggest problem here. More seriously, anger too often parades itself as Godly-virtue, as righteousness, as prophecy, as a healthy, divinely-inspired militancy for truth, for cause, for virtue, for God. And so we define ourselves as "holy warriors" and "vigilant defenders of truth", taking justification in the popular (though false) conception that prophets are angry people, on passionate fire for God.

A cynic, it's said, is someone who has given up, but not shut up! He's also someone who has confused one of the seven deadly sins, wrath, with virtue. (Father Ron Rolheiser)

As an act of religion, our devotion to Mary in all its many forms is one of the many expressions of our Catholic faith. Devotion to Mary is not merely an invention of Mary's devotees; it is rooted on scriptures and Catholic doctrine. Finally, I encourage you not just to have devotion to Mary but to have a living vibrant relationship with her and to see her not only as a God-given helper but also as a God-given teacher who has lived life in all its circumstances.
