From Monsignor Ron ...

The Image of the good Shepherd highlights many things and reminds us that compared with God's greatness we are as helpless as sheep. While we may rather not think about this, preferring to be proud of our achievements and status, is good for us to be reminded that we are all dependent upon God's grace and that our God will always be there for us. Through God's grace we are given the great gift of Jesus to be a Shepherd and we can be confident that if we follow him, we are in the very best of care. So today let us reflect upon that wonderful Psalm.

The Lord is my Shepherd is one of the most beautiful Psalms and one that we should pray and reflect on very often. So many of the Psalm's images remind us of the life with God, a life of security, comfort, beauty, peace, and joy.

At the same time, we are presented with a realistic description of life in relationship to God. Such a life has times of gladness and overflowing joy. We also pass through difficult and stressful times as well. Our fundamental security throughout this life, which contains both light and dark, is God's commitment to us. In all the events of life he is with us, loving us. We are never alone.

To me, one of the marvelous points that the Psalm puts before us is that our God is our perfect companion who is with us every instant of our lives. This truth is of course beautifully exemplified in the Sacrament of Baptism and in Holy Communion where our God unites himself totally to us.

As well as being a loving and caring God, we are reminded that he is a concerned God who offers us perfect provision, perfect acceptance, perfect care, and the perfect destiny. He offers us perfect provision in that he gives us the means to survive today. He offers us perfect acceptance in that he will always love us and he will never reject us. He offers us perfect care because he loves us and wants to help us, and of course he always knows what is best for us. He offers us a perfect destiny in that he invites us to join him for eternal life.

In other words, we have a God who strives always to bring us to our full potential. This Psalms speaks to us about God's attitude to us. But, also, it calls us to love others and care for ourselves as he does for us; this means that it is a challenging Psalm as well.

In the Psalm we see the love of God for us and we see also his desire to support us. On our side, part of our response has to be to find plenty of space and time to be with our God.

THE CURRENT SITUATION DUE TO LOCKDOWN:

Once again we have been experiencing a lockdown across Greater Sydney and this of course creates all types of difficulties for everyone. In regard to practising our faith and gathering as a community, there have been severe, but necessary restrictions. We are still unsure how long this will continue and what impact it will have on parish activities.

What we do know is that we cannot gather as a community for the celebration of Mass. While it is nowhere close to the same thing, I do remind you that each day there is a live stream of the Mass at 9:00 AM during weekdays and 9:30 AM on Sundays. I do encourage people to make the most of this opportunity to spend time with the Lord and to make this a major part of your daily prayer. The Mass is live streamed on Facebook and within one hour of the celebration of Mass, will be available on YouTube.

While the present restrictions continue, we are unable to hold the usual meetings that take place each week in the parish. I do know that some of our groups still function through the use of Zoom or other means of communication.

What is important during this time is that we continue to live out our faith in the best possible ways we can. It is important that we do make time for prayer each day and here I would suggest spending this time on a number of occasions throughout the day. It is also important that we realise this can be a very stressful time on families and will probably demand a special effort at patience in regard to family life and relationships.

In regard to reception of the sacraments, we ask that no Eucharistic Ministers of Communion, Acolytes or Ministers of the Altar take communion to the sick and housebound. If this is going to happen, it can only be through the activity of a family member.

Be assured of our prayerful support during this time.

FEAST DAYS THIS WEEK:

FEAST OF ST MARY MAGDALENE

Thursday, July 22 Pope Francis has raised the celebration of the memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to the dignity of a liturgical Feast, recognizing the importance of her role as the "apostle to the apostles."

Mary Magdalene was the first witness to the Resurrection, and is the one who announced the event to the Apostles.

"Saint Mary Magdalene is an example of true and authentic evangelization; she is an evangelist who announces the joyful central message of Easter," he writes.

"Therefore, it is right that the liturgical celebration of this woman has the same grade of feast given to the celebration of the apostles in the General Roman Calendar and shines a light on the special mission of this woman, who is an example and model for every woman in the Church."

Sacrament of Confirmation 2021



We are still unsure what the impact of the restrictions will be on the Sacrament of Confirmation Program. What we have done is to place the registration form online (*Linked below*) and ask people to fill them out and submit or email them back to us. There will also be registration forms available from the parish office during the restricted times the office is open. If students to return to school, we will make these forms available through the schools.

It may be necessary to conduct a program similar to how we did it last year in regard to preparation. However, that will be decided over the next couple of weeks. What we did last year was to conduct a meeting for parents only and then asked the parents prepare the candidates at home. Obviously, at this time we are also unable to state definitely when the Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered. Our hope, of course, is that the

timetable for the administration of the Sacrament will remain the same.

we are planning to commence the program for the Sacrament of Confirmation during term 3.

In regard to this program it is important to remember that this is a parish based program. To be eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at this time, the candidates must be in at least year 5 and have received their First Holy Communion. 2021-Confirmation-Form.pdf (standrewsmarayong.org.au)
