PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION

The Peter's Pence Collection is traditionally taken up throughout Catholic parishes around the time of the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul and the 2022 collection will take place on 26 June. This collection helps provide the Holy Father with funds for emergency assistance to those in need. The proceeds enable Pope Francis to assist the most disadvantaged in emergency situations including victims of war, oppression, and disasters. Thank you for your generosity.

The history of Peter's Pence dates back to the ninth century when King Alfred the Great collected a "pence" from English landowners to provide financial support for the Pope. In the 1860s Pope Pius IX instituted the Peter's Pence Collection as a special appeal. The Peter's Pence Collection continues today as a way to help support the charitable works of the Holy Father.

This appeal will be taken up as a leaving collection at all Masses this weekend.

Understanding our Christian calling

The readings of the thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary time present to us the meaning of our Christian vocation. The English word “vocation” comes from the Latin word “vocatio” which means “calling”. Our vocation is rooted in our baptism. In baptism we become children of God. He (God) calls us to be part of Him and His mission. As baptised children of God, we have purpose and responsibilities to live out in our life.

In the gospel, Jesus is explaining to his listeners what it means to be his followers. To follow Christ calls for radical expression of our faith. We are called to fully focus and submit to the will of God. And to fully give ourselves totally to the will of God means we must detach ourselves from earthly things that distracts us to follow Christ. Our world today is designed in a way that humans focus on what makes them happy and what satisfy their desires.

To follow Christ calls for total submission to the will of the Father. It is a call to sacrifice and to commit ourselves to the work of God. Detaching ourselves from earthly distraction enable us to fully focus on Christ and to follow him with faith and confidence. In the gospel Jesus is pointing out few examples that can distract us from following him. Jesus is making us aware of the choices we need to make in life. Whether we choose him and be part of him or we choose our life and things that pull us away from him.

My friends, the readings for this Sunday invite us to reflect on our personal life. How do we as individuals live out our Christian calling? How do we respond to Jesus? Let us spend some time to identify what are the things that holds us back from fully following Christ.
